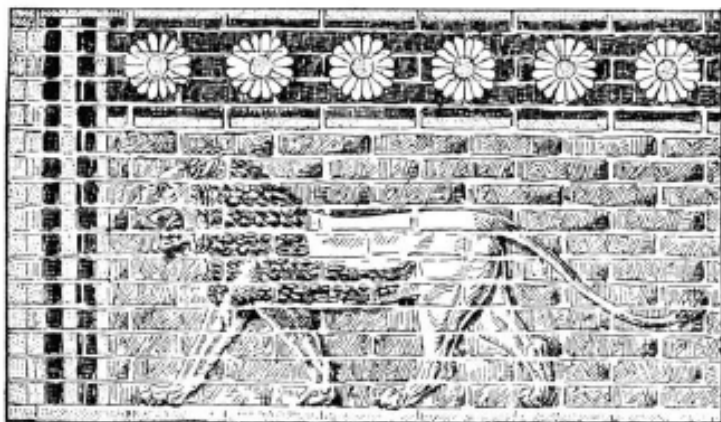

ARTISANS' TOOLS (1)

Reed — a straight stalk of various tall grasses

Animal skins — removed from animals and dried through the process of tanning

Mold — a hollow form that gives shape to something in a molten state

Cotton — plant whose bud can be used in making cloth or thread

Bellows — an instrument that is used to create a strong stream of air to draft a fire

Pegs — a pin of wood driven or fitted into something to fasten parts or hang something on

ARTISANS' TOOLS (2)

Thread — twisted fibers of any kind used for sewing

Jewels — a cut and polished stone of great durability and ornamental value

Dirt — when moist, forms mud

Metal — a substance that can be formed in a liquid or heated state, but is very sturdy and solid in a regular state

Wheel — a circular frame used to turn on its axis, as in vehicles or machinery

Kiln — a furnace or oven used for burning, baking or drying something

ARTISANS' TOOLS (3)

Cloth — a fabric formed by weaving together hair, silk, flax, cotton, or other fibers

Lapis lazuli — a deep blue stone which contains several minerals; used chiefly for ornamental purposes

Hammer — used for beating metal or driving pegs and nails

Hoe — used to break the surface of the ground

Sand — made of fine debris of rocks, creating grains usually of quartz

Sewing machine — mechanical device used for sewing

ARTISANS' TOOLS (4)

Dowels — pins fitted into holes of two adjacent pieces to prevent slipping or to align the pieces

Drill press — a machine tool used for drilling holes

Stones — the hard substance from which rocks consist

Wheat — plant which bears edible grain in dense spikes

Saw — a tool or device for cutting

Anvil — a heavy iron block with a smooth surface on which metals are hammered into desired shapes

Awl — a pointed instrument used for piercing holes in leather, wood, etc.

Loom — an apparatus used for turning yarn or thread into fabric

Compass — an instrument used to determine direction

Clay — a material that can be easily manipulated when wet but hardens when dry

Watch — something which measures time

Timber — the wood of trees that is suitable for structural purposes
